



AMOS

Chapter 1

1 ¶ The words of Amos who was among the ^aherdsmen of ^bTekoa, that he saw concerning Israel in the days of ^cUzziah king of Judah, and in the days of ^dJeroboam the son of Joash king of Israel, two years before the ^eearthquake.

2 And he said, “The LORD will ^froar from Zion and utter His voice from Jerusalem. Then the pastures of the shepherds will mourn and the top of ^gCarmel will wither.”

Judgment of the Nations

3 ¶ Thus says the LORD, “For three transgressions of ^hDamascus and for four, I will not turn away its *punishment* because they have threshed Gilead with ⁱthreshing instruments of iron.

4 ^j“But I will send a fire into the house of Hazael that will devour the palaces of ^kBenhadad.

5 “I will break also the ^lbar of Damascus and cut off the inhabitant from the Valley of Aven, and the one who holds the scepter from the house of Eden. And the people of Syria will go into captivity to Kir,” says the LORD.

6 ¶ Thus says the LORD, “For three transgressions of ^mGaza and for four, I will not turn away its *punishment* because they carried away captive the

whole captivity in order to deliver *them* up to Edom.

7 ⁿ“But I will send a fire on the wall of Gaza that will devour its palaces.

8 “And I will cut off the inhabitant ^ofrom Ashdod and the one who holds the scepter from Ashkelon. And ^pI will turn My hand against Ekron. And the ^qremnant of the Philistines will perish,” says the Lord GOD.

9 ¶ Thus says the LORD, “For three transgressions of ^rTyre and for four, I will not turn away its *punishment* because they delivered up the whole captivity to Edom and did not remember the brotherly covenant.

10 “But I will send a fire on the wall of Tyre that will devour its palaces.”

11 ¶ Thus says the LORD, “For three transgressions of ^sEdom and for four, I will not turn away its *punishment* because he pursued his ^tbrother with the sword and cast off all pity. And his anger tore perpetually, and he kept his wrath forever.

12 “But ^uI will send a fire on Teman that will devour the palaces of Bozrah.”

13 ¶ Thus says the LORD, “For three transgressions of the ^vchildren of Ammon and for four, I will not turn away its *punishment* because they have ripped up the women with child of Gilead so that they might enlarge their border.

14 “But I will kindle a fire in the wall of ^wRabbah and it will devour its palaces, with ^xshouting in the day of battle, with a tempest in the day of the whirlwind.

15 ^y“And their king will go into captivity, he and his princes together,” says the LORD.

Chapter 2

1 ¶ Thus says the LORD, “For ^athree transgressions of Moab and for four, I will not turn away its *punishment* because he ^bburned the bones of the king of Edom into lime.

2 “But I will send a fire on Moab and it will devour the palaces of ^cKirioth. And Moab will die with tumult, with shouting *and* with the sound of the trumpet.

3 “And I will cut off the ^djudge from the midst of it and will slay all its princes with him,” says the LORD.

4 ¶ Thus says the LORD, “For three transgressions of ^eJudah and for four, I will not turn away its *punishment* ^fbecause they have despised the law of the LORD and have not kept His commandments. And ^gtheir lies caused them to err, *lies* after ^hwhich the fathers followed.

5 ⁱ“But I will send a fire on Judah and it will devour the palaces of Jerusalem.”

Judgment on Israel

6 ¶ Thus says the LORD, “For three transgressions of ^jIsrael and for four,

I will not turn away its *punishment* because ^kthey sold the righteous for silver and the ^lpoor for a pair of shoes

7 “They pant after the dust of the earth on the head of the poor and ^mpervert the way of the meek. ⁿAnd a man and his father will go in to the *same* girl ^oto profane My holy name.

8 “And they lie down ^pby every altar on clothes ^qtaken in pledge. And they drink the wine of the condemned *in* the house of their god.

9 ¶ “Yet *it was* I who destroyed the ^rAmorite before them, whose ^sheight *was* like the height of the cedars, and he *was* strong as the oaks. Yet I ^tdestroyed his fruit from above and his roots from beneath.

10 ^u“I also brought you up from the land of Egypt and ^vled you forty years through the wilderness in order to possess the land of the Amorite.

11 “Then I raised up of your sons for ^wprophets and of your young men for ^xNazarites. *Is it* not even as this, O you children of Israel?” says the LORD.

12 “But you gave the Nazarites wine to drink, and commanded the prophets, ^ysaying, ‘Do not prophesy.’

13 ¶ “Behold, ^zI will crush you, as a cart is weighed down *when* full of sheaves.

14 ^a“Therefore, flight will perish from the swift, and the strong will not strengthen his force, ^bnor will the mighty deliver himself.

15 “Neither will he stand who

handles the bow. And *he who is* swift of foot will not deliver *himself*, nor will he who rides the horse deliver himself.

16 “And *he who is* courageous among the mighty will flee away naked in that day,” says the LORD.

Chapter 3

Witness Against Israel

1 ¶ Hear this word that the LORD has spoken against you, O children of Israel, against the whole family that He brought up from the land of Egypt, saying,

2 “You only I have known of all the families of the earth. ^bTherefore, I will punish you for all your iniquities.”

3 Can two walk together, except they have agreed?

4 Will a lion roar in the forest when he has no prey? Will a young lion cry out of his den if he has taken nothing?

5 Can a bird fall in a snare on the earth where no trap *is* for it? Will *one* take up a snare from the earth and have taken nothing at all?

6 Will a trumpet be blown in the city and the people not be afraid? ^cIf a calamity occurs in a city has not the LORD done *it*?

7 Surely the Lord GOD will do nothing without *first* ^drevealing His plans to His servants the prophets.

8 The lion has roared. Who will not fear? The Lord GOD has spoken. ^eWho can but prophesy?

9 ¶ Proclaim in the palaces at Ashdod

and in the palaces in the land of Egypt, and say, “Assemble yourselves on the mountains of Samaria and behold the great unrest in its midst and the oppressed in its midst.

10 “For they ^fdo not know *how* to do right,” says the LORD, “who store up violence and robbery in their palaces.”

11 ¶ Therefore, thus says the Lord GOD, “An adversary *will be* throughout the land. And he will bring down your strength from you and your palaces will be plundered.”

12 Thus says the LORD, “As the shepherd takes out of the mouth of the lion two legs, or a piece of an ear, so will the sons of Israel dwelling in Samaria be snatched away—in *the* corner of a bed and *the* cover of a couch!

13 “Hear and testify in the house of Jacob,” says the Lord GOD, the God of armies.

14 “For in the day that I will visit the transgressions of Israel on him I will also visit the altars of ^gBethel. And the horns of the altar will be cut off and fall to the ground.

15 “And I will smite the ^hwinter house with the ⁱsummer house. And the ^jhouses of ivory will perish, and the great houses will have an end,” says the LORD.

Chapter 4

Failure to Repent

1 ¶ Hear this word, you ^acows of Bashan who *are* on Mount Samaria, who oppress the ^bpoor, who crush the

needy, who say to their husbands, "Bring now, that we may ^cdrink."

2 ^dThe Lord GOD has sworn by His holiness, "Behold, the days will come on you when He will take you away with ^ehooks and your posterity with hooks.

3 "And ^fyou will each go straight out through the breaches *in the wall*, and you will be cast toward Harmon," says the LORD.

4 ¶ "Come ^gto Bethel and transgress. At ^hGilgal multiply transgression. And ⁱbring your sacrifices every morning *and* ^jyour tithes every three days.

5 "And ^koffer a sacrifice of thanksgiving with leaven, and proclaim *and* publish the ^lfree-will offerings. For so you love *to do*, O you children of Israel," says the Lord GOD.

6 ¶ "And I also have given you cleanness of teeth in all your cities, and lack of bread in all your places. ^mYet you have not returned to Me," says the LORD.

7 "And I have also withheld the rain from you when *there were* still three months until the harvest. And I caused it to rain on one city, and caused it not to rain on another city. One part was rained on, and the part on which it did not rain withered.

8 "So two *or* three cities wandered to one city, to drink water. But they were not satisfied. Yet you have not returned to Me," says the LORD.

9 "I have blasted you with scorching *wind* and mildew. When your

gardens and your vineyards and your fig trees and your olive trees increased, the ^olocust devoured *them*. Yet you have not returned to Me," says the LORD.

10 "I have sent among you the pestilence ^pafter the manner of Egypt. Your young men I have slain with the sword, and have taken away your horses. And I have made the stench of your camps come up to your nostrils. Yet you have not returned to Me," says the LORD.

11 "I have destroyed *some* of your cities, as God overthrew ^qSodom and Gomorrah, and you were as a firebrand plucked out of the burning. Yet you have not returned to Me," says the LORD.

12 ¶ "Therefore, thus I will do to you, O Israel. And because I will do this to you, ^rprepare to meet your God, O Israel."

13 For behold, He who forms the mountains and creates the wind, and ^sdeclares to man what *is* his thoughts, who makes the morning darkness and ^ttreads on the high places of the earth, the ^uLORD God of armies is His name.

Chapter 5

Call to Repentance

1 ¶ Hear you this word that I ^vtake up against you, *even* a lamentation, O house of Israel.

2 The virgin of Israel has fallen. She will no longer rise. She is forsaken on her land. *There is* no one to raise her up.

3 For thus says the Lord GOD, “The city that went out *by* a thousand will have a hundred left, and that which went out *by* a hundred will have ten left to the house of Israel.”

4 ¶ For thus says the LORD to the house of Israel, ^b“Seek Me and ^cyou will live.”

5 “But do not seek ^dBethel, nor enter into Gilgal. And do not pass to ^eBeersheba. For Gilgal will surely go into captivity and ^fBethel will come to nought.

6 ^g“Seek the LORD and you will live, lest He break out like fire in the house of Joseph and devour *it*, and *there be* no one to quench *it* in Bethel.

7 “You who ^hturn justice to wormwood, and cast down righteousness to the earth,

8 “*seek Him* who makes the ⁱPleiades and Orion and turns the shadow of death into the morning, and ^jmakes the day dark with night, who ^kcalls for the waters of the sea and pours them out on the face of the earth. ^lThe LORD *is* his name.”

9 ¶ He causes ruin to burst forth on the strong, and brings destruction on the fortress.

10 ^mThey hate him who rebukes in the gate, and they ⁿabhor him who speaks uprightly.

11 ^oTherefore, because you trample on the poor and you take from him tribute of grain, and ^phave built mansions of hewn stone, you will not dwell in them. You have planted pleasant vineyards, but you will not

drink wine from them.

12 For I ^qknow your many transgressions and your mighty sins. They ^rafflict the just. They take a bribe, and they ^sturn aside the poor in the gate.

13 Therefore, the ^tprudent will keep silence in that time, for it *is* an evil time.

14 ¶ Seek good and not evil, so that you may live. And so the LORD, the God of hosts, will be with you ^uas you have said.

15 ^vHate the evil and love the good, and establish justice at the gate. ^wIt may be that the LORD God of armies will be gracious to the remnant of Joseph.

16 ¶ Therefore, the LORD, the God of armies, the Lord, says thus, “Wailing *will be* in all streets. And they will say in all the highways, ‘Alas! Alas!’ And they will call the farmer to mourning and ^xprofessional mourners to lamentation.

17 “And in all vineyards *there is* wailing because ^yI will pass through you,” says the LORD.

The Day of the Lord

18 ¶ ^zWoe to you who desire the day of the LORD! To what end *is* it for you? The ^aday of the LORD *is* darkness and not light.

19 As if a ^bman flees from a lion and a bear met him, or went into the house and leaned his hand on the wall, and a serpent bit him.

20 *Will* not the day of the LORD *be* darkness and not light, even gloom

with no brightness in it?

21 ¶^c“I hate, I despise your feast days. And ^dI will not take delight in your solemn assemblies.

22 ^e“Though you offer Me burnt offerings and your grain offerings, I will not accept *them*. Neither will I regard the peace offerings of your fat beasts.

23 “Take away from Me the noise of your songs, for I will not hear the melody of your stringed instruments.

24 ^f“But let justice run down as waters and righteousness as an overflowing stream.

25 ¶^g“Have you offered to Me sacrifices and offerings in the wilderness forty years, O house of Israel?

26 “But you have borne the shrine of ^hyour king and the pedestal of your images, the star of your god that you made for yourselves.

27 “Therefore, I will cause you to go into captivity ‘beyond Damascus,” says the LORD, ^jwhose name *is* the God of armies.

Chapter 6

Woe to the Indifferent

1 ¶^aWoe to those *who are* at ^bease in Zion, and who ^ctrust in the mountain of Samaria, *who are* named ^dforemost among the nations, to whom the house of Israel comes!

2 ^eGo over to ^fCalneh and see. And from there go to ^gHamath the great. Then go down to Gath of the Philistines. ^h*Are they* better than these king-

doms, or their border greater than your border?

3 ¶ *Woe* to you who ⁱput off the day of ^jcalamity and ^kwho bring near the ^lseat of violence,

4 who lie on beds of ivory and stretch themselves on their couches, and eat the lambs out of the flock and the calves out of the midst of the stall,

5 ^mwho sing idly to the sound of the stringed instruments, *and* invent for themselves ⁿinstruments of music ^olike David,

6 who ^pdrink wine in bowls and anoint themselves with the chief ointments, ^qbut are not grieved because of the affliction of Joseph.

7 Therefore, they will go ^rcaptive with the first who go captive. And those who recline at banquets will be removed.

Abhorrence of Israel's Pride

8 ¶^sThe Lord GOD has sworn by Himself, says the LORD the God of hosts, “I abhor the ^tpride of Jacob and hate his palaces. Therefore, I will deliver up the city with all who are in it.”

9 And it will come to pass that if there remains ten men in one house, they will die.

10 Then a man’s relative will take him up, or he who burns *the bodies* will lift him up to carry out *his* bones from the house. Then he will say to the one who is in the innermost part of the house, “*Is there* still any with

you?” And he will say, “No.” Then he will say, “Keep quiet. ^wFor the name of the LORD is not to be mentioned.”

11 For behold, the ^wLORD commands and ^xHe will smite the great house into bits and the little house into pieces.

12 ¶ Will horses run on the rock? Will *one* plow *there* with oxen? For ^yyou have turned justice into gall and the fruit of righteousness into wormwood,

13 you who rejoice in the conquest of Lo Debar, who say, “Have we not by our *own* strength taken Karnaim for ourselves?”

14 “For behold, ^zI will raise up against you a nation, O house of Israel,” says the LORD the God of armies. “And they will afflict you from the ^aentrance of Hamath to the valley of the Arabah.”

Chapter 7

Judgment

1 ¶ Thus has the Lord GOD showed to me, and behold, He formed the locust swarms at the beginning of the late crop. And lo, *it was* the late crop after the king’s mowing.

2 Now it came to pass when they had finished eating the grass of the land, that I said, “O Lord GOD, forgive, I beseech You. ^aBy whom will Jacob arise, for he *is* small?”

3 The ^bLORD relented from this. “It will not be,” says the LORD.

4 ¶ Thus has the Lord GOD showed

to me. And behold, the Lord GOD called to contend by fire, and it devoured the great deep and ate up part *of the land*.

5 ¶ Then I said, “O Lord GOD, please stop, I beseech You. ^cBy whom will Jacob arise, for he *is* small?”

6 The LORD relented from this. “This also will not be,” says the Lord GOD.

7 ¶ Therefore, He showed me, and behold, the Lord stood on a wall *made* by a plumb line, with a plumb line in His hand.

8 Thus the LORD said to me, “Amos, what do you see?” And I said, “A plumb line.” Then the Lord said, “Behold, ^dI will set a plumb line in the midst of My people Israel. ^eI will not again pass by them anymore.

9 “^fAnd the high places of Isaac will be desolate and the sanctuaries of Israel will be laid waste. And ^gI will rise against the house of Jeroboam with the sword.”

Amos and Amaziah

10 ¶ Then Amaziah the ^hpriest of ⁱBethel sent to ^jJeroboam king of Israel, saying, “Amos has conspired against you in the midst of the house of Israel. The land is not able to bear all his words.

11 “For thus Amos says, ‘Jeroboam will die by the sword and Israel will surely be led away ^kcaptively out of their own land.’”

12 Amaziah also said to Amos, “Go,

you seer. Flee away into the land of Judah and there eat bread and prophesy there.

13 “But ^ldo not prophesy again anymore at Bethel, ^mfor it is a sanctuary of the king and a royal residence.”

14 ¶ Then Amos answered and said to Amaziah, “I *was* no prophet, nor *was* I a ^pprophet’s son. But I *was* a ^oherdsman and a gatherer of sycamore figs.

15 “And the LORD took me as I followed the flock and the LORD said to me, ‘Go, ^pprophesy to My people Israel.’”

16 “Now therefore hear the word of the LORD. You are saying, ‘Do not prophesy against Israel and ^qdo not speak against the house of Isaac.’”

17 “Therefore, ^rthus says the LORD, ^s“Your wife will be a harlot in the city and your sons and your daughters will fall by the sword. And your land will be measured and divided. And you will die in a ^tdefiled land, and Israel will surely go into captivity out of his land.””

Chapter 8

Basket of Summer Fruit

1 ¶ Thus has the Lord GOD showed to me, and behold a basket of summer fruit.

2 And He said, “Amos, what do you see?” And I said, “A basket of summer fruit.” Then the LORD said to me, ^a“The end has come on My people of Israel. ^bI will not again pass by them anymore.

3 “And the ^csongs of the temple will be wailings in that day,” says the Lord GOD. “*There will be* many dead bodies in every place. ^dThey will cast *them* out with silence.

4 ¶ “Hear this, O you who swallow up the needy, even to make the poor of the land to fail,

5 “saying, ‘When will the new moon be gone so that we may sell grain, and the ^eSabbath so that we may market wheat, ^fmaking the ephah small and the shekel great, and cheat with ^gdishonest scales,

6 ‘so that we may buy the poor for ^hsilver and the needy for a pair of shoes, and *that* we may sell the sweepings of the wheat?’”

7 ¶ The LORD has sworn by the ⁱpride of Jacob, “Surely ^jI will never forget any of their works.

8 ^k“Will not the land tremble because of this, and everyone mourn who dwells in it? And it will rise up like the Nile. And it will be tossed about and subside ^llike the Nile of Egypt.

9 “Then it will come to pass in that day,” says the Lord GOD, ^m“that I will cause the sun to go down at noon and I will darken the earth in the clear day.

10 “And I will turn your feasts into ⁿmourning and ^oall your songs into lamentation. ^pAnd I will bring up sackcloth on all loins and baldness on every head. And I will make it as the mourning of an only *son* and its end as a bitter day.

11 ¶ “Behold, the days are coming,”

says the Lord GOD, “that I will send a famine on the land, not a famine of bread, nor a thirst for water, ^qbut of hearing the words of the LORD.

12 “And they will wander from sea to sea, and from the north even to the east. They will run to and fro to seek the word of the LORD, and ^twill not find it.

13 “In that day the fair virgins and young men will faint because of thirst.

14 “They who ^sswear by the ^lsin of Samaria, and say, ‘Your god, O Dan, lives,’ and, ‘The way of ^uBeersheba lives,’ even they will fall and never rise up again.”

Chapter 9

Destruction of Israel

1 ¶ I saw the Lord standing by the altar. And He said, “Strike the lintel of the door so that the posts may shake. And ^abreak them on the heads of them all. And I will slay the last of them with the sword. ^bHe who flees of them will not flee away. And he who escapes of them will not be delivered.

2 “Though ^cthey dig into Sheol, from there My hand will take them. ^dThough they climb up to heaven, from there I will bring them down.

3 “And though they ^ehide themselves on the top of Carmel, I will search and take them out from there. And though they hide from My sight in the bottom of the sea, from there I will command the serpent, and he will bite them.

4 “And though they go into captivity before their enemies, from there ^fI will command the sword, and it will slay them. And ^gI will set My eyes on them for calamity and not for good.”

5 ¶ And the Lord GOD of armies *is* He who touches the land, and it will ^hmelt, and ⁱall who dwell in it will mourn. And it will rise up like the Nile and subside like the Nile of Egypt.

6 *It is* He who builds his ^jlofty place in the heavens, and has set His foundation on the earth. ^kHe who calls for the waters of the sea and pours them out on the face of the earth, the ^lLORD *is* His name.

7 ¶ “Are you not as children of the Ethiopians to me, O children of Israel?” says the LORD. “Have I not brought up Israel out of the land of Egypt, and the ^mPhilistines from ⁿCaphtor, and the Syrians from ^oKir? **8** “Behold, the ^peyes of the Lord GOD *are* on the sinful kingdom, and I ^qwill destroy it from off the face of the earth. Nevertheless, I will not totally destroy the house of Jacob,” says the LORD.

9 “For behold, I will command and I will sift the house of Israel among all nations, like *grain* is sifted in a sieve, ^ryet a kernel will not fall to the ground.

10 “All the sinners of My people will die by the sword, those ^swho say, ‘The calamity will not overtake or confront us.’

Restoration of Israel

11 ¶ “In that day will I raise up the tabernacle of David that has fallen and close up its breaches. And I will raise up its ruins and I will build it as in the days of old,

12 “so that they may possess the remnant of ^vEdom and all the nations who are called by My name,” says the LORD who does this.

13 ¶ “Behold, ^wthe days are coming,” says the LORD, “when the plowman will overtake the reaper, and the treader of grapes him who sows seed. And ^xthe mountains will

drip sweet wine and all the hills will be dissolved.

14 ^y“And I will bring again the captivity of My people of Israel and ^zthey will build the ruined cities and inhabit *them*. And they will plant vineyards and drink their wine. They will also make gardens and eat the fruit of them.

15 “And I will plant them in their land and ^athey will never again be pulled up out of their land that I have given them,” says the LORD your God.
